# CCQG Supports the Community Through Its Annual Charitable Giving

It was another magnificent year of generosity from our guild members, aiding our guild in its support of local charities. While Covid continues to put a damper on opportunities to get together and sew, that did not impact our charity efforts. A heartfelt thank you to each of you for continuing to donate time, talent, and treasures. Our guild donations for 2021 included:

- Kendall County Women's Shelter 15 quilts and 14 pillowcases
- University Hospital NICU 24 baby quilts
- Sleep in Heavenly Peace 2 twin bed quilts
- Menger Springs Morningside Ministries- 12 clothing protectors, 9 wheelchair quits, 2 prayer shawls, 2 activity mats, and 2 neck scarves
- Cibolo Creek Nursing Home and Rehabilitation Center 11 clothing protectors, 9 wheelchair quilts, 2 prayer shawls, and 2 activity mats
- Quilts of Honor 26 quilt tops, 2 completed quilts, and 22 pillowcases
- Hill Country Family Services 332 pounds of food, toiletries, and toys

We also partnered again with the Hill Country Council of the Arts on its "Stocking Stuffer" efforts by sewing 140 stockings. The stockings were filled with donations from local businesses and delivered to the Kendall County Women's Shelter and the Boerne Pregnancy Center.


